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WHAT IS BARKER CREEK

COMMUNITY SCHOOL?

Barker Creek Community School (BCCS) provides alternative education opportunities for students in grades K-12: parent partnership program, online learning opportunities, direct instruction, and guided instruction for students to meet the requirements for earning their high school diploma. Each student at our school has a Written Student Learning Plan (WSLP) which guides his or her course of study. Students in grades K-8 currently have the option of the parent partnership program and online learning for students who qualify.

Each month, students meet with their homeroom teacher /consultant at an Advisory meeting to monitor success and set goals. Parents are strongly encouraged to attend.

The commitment to help each student reach state academic standards and to earn their high school diploma continues to be the emphasis of our program. Staff strive each year to identify needs and make improvements in the program to meet the changing student population.

Barker Creek Community School provides students with an academic program that meets a wide variety of student abilities, attitudes and learning styles. It has established a tradition of cooperation and pride in accomplishment.

WHAT WE OFFER—Grades—9-12

We offer all the courses a student will need to complete their CKSD high school diploma.

BCCS has a 9-12 grade program, a full schedule for students will be three classes (periods) each hexmester

There will be a shuttle transportation at the beginning and the end of the school day

BCCS has a lunch program for students

BCCS has a hexmester schedule that allows students to earn up to 9 credits each school year

BCCS 9-12 students are on-campus Monday through Thursday and attend 3 classes per day. K-8 students are invited to attend an enrichment day offered once per week

APPLICATION PROCESS

- ◆ Complete the registration paperwork from our website or you may pick up the paperwork at 1400 McWilliams Road, Bremerton.
- ◆ Take a Math and Reading placement test. Students must score into 6th grade reading and math ability to be eligible for the high school program and can re-test one time.
- ◆ Continue to attend classes at your current school while completing orientation. The orientation (s) will be held after the school day. (K-8 do not need an orientation).
- ◆ After the successful completion of orientation you will be offered enrollment at BCCS.

* We do have a limited enrollment, which means that during the school year, students may be on a waiting list until space becomes available.
